Located at the crossroads of cultures, nations, economic interests, and ideologies, Rijeka had experienced rapid modernization but also radical societal ruptures from the beginning of the 18th century until today. Squeezed between the sea and the mountains, the urban culture of Rijeka is marked by simultaneous conflicts and cooperation between the industrial- infrastructural complex and the public domain. The book outlines key episodes of its fantastic history in which numerous dilemmas of global modern society are sharpened to the extreme. Talk will outline some of the leading episodes of the urban history of Rijeka and briefly tackle relationship between the book and the exhibition formats.

The redrawing process functions as a semi-automatic generator of hierarchy within which parallel layers of interpretation arise in team reference exchange, further developing a methodological language in need of a notational procedure.

The intervention is focused on the methodological approach of the ongoing PhD research at Politecnico di Milano, entitled Ark Architecture. Space Suspension Strategies, supervisor Prof. Sara Marini, co-supervisor Prof. Alessandro Rocca. The method, a way to follow planned in advance, is seen in this research as the prophecy of the work. The question arises as to whether a legendary architectural figure as ark can dictate the way, becoming a method itself. It is a question of narration, of translation of legends into architecture, a mythological-critical method.

The research builds on an explorative method, formulating hypothesis and conclusions not directly inscribed in the architecture tradition but that derive from it crucial premises. At once, the theme is shaped by multidisciplinary, also considering project from different fields that, even when not purposefully, anticipated some key issues or that influence the discourse on the matter. Ultimately, the project is perceived as a control mechanism on an existing condition and its effortless flow of information. It represents one of many possible choices, creating a peculiar standpoint informed by the research activity.

As for my limited experience as a "writer", I realize the difficulty and danger of repetition and the monotony of form and concepts. I think it would be helpful to have a "project" comparison on the guidelines adopted in writing with colleagues in the editorial project so that this takes on meaning within the context of publication. This can make the difference between high-level editorial products, in which the overall structure is clear, and those that are not. Moving on to my experience as a "reader," I think that there are few magazines nowadays (for example, Lotus) that proceed in this direction.
